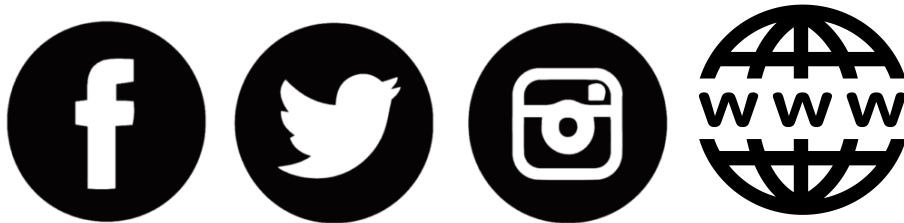


CCPPP Student Engagement

A main finding from the survey was a recommendation to increase advertisement and communication via additional social media platforms. Reminder to Academic and Internship Training Directors - Please forward CCPPP info to your students:

Another important finding from the survey was that 68% of students reported that the best method to disseminate CCPPP student information is via their Directors of Clinical Training. Therefore, a friendly reminder to forward emails from CCPPP to your student body, and highlight relevant information for them (e.g., directing them to this section of the CCPPP newsletter). We also recommend including information about the CCPPP in your graduate orientation packages.

Student Internship Travel Awards 2019

The CCPPP Executive is happy to announce five travel awards made available to psychology graduate students applying to internship. The awards are valued at \$100 each, which students can use to help offset some of the travel costs incurred with attending internship interviews. Last year five travel awards were given to students at the University of New Brunswick, the University of Toronto, Concordia University, and Western University.

Eligibility

1. You must be a psychology graduate student currently in the process of applying for internship in the APPIC match in fall 2019.
2. You must be from a program that is affiliated as a CCPPP member.

Application Instructions

To enter your name to be considered for these awards you need to interact with one of our social media accounts for CCPPP students by “following” or “liking” and sending a confirmation email that you have done so by emailing the student rep at ccpppstudentmember@gmail.com.

Please include the following information in your email:

Subject line: Internship Travel Award Entry

Email Body:

a. Name (first, last)

b. Your social media affiliated account name that you used to follow/like our social media platform(s)

c. Indicate which social media platform you interacted with (e.g., “followed @ccpppstudents Twitter account”)

d. University Name & Program

e. Your APPIC match number

Each social media account you interact with = 1 entry. So, if you follow all three of our social media accounts, indicate that in your email, as that would result in 3 entries.

For students who wish to be entered but do not want to interact via social media, you can still send an email using the instructions above and indicate your preference under b. and c. to not use social media.

Entries will be accepted from November 1, 2019 to December 30, 2019.

Award Decisions

The five award winners will be randomly drawn lottery style in February 2020. The CCPPP Student Rep will notify the winners via email.
